The mission of the Hutton Junior Fisheries Biology Program is to engage, inspire and support diversity in the next generation of fisheries and aquatic specialists.

The principal goal of the Hutton Junior Fisheries Biology Program is to recruit high school students from traditionally underrepresented communities in the fisheries profession and introduce them to the field of fisheries and aquatic science. This is done by matching selected students with a mentor in an 8-week paid summer internship among fisheries and aquatic specialists. The stipend for selected students is \$3,000. We hope the student's experience through the Hutton Program is the catalyst that encourages them to study and ultimately pursue a career working in the field of fisheries and aquatic sciences.

**To be considered for the Hutton Junior Fisheries Biology Program, you are required to provide a statement of interest, answer two short essay questions, one of which will require a 1-2 minute video response, provide school transcripts, and a Student Reference Form. For your application to be considered, all application materials must be received by the application deadline, January 25, 2026 (11:59PM PST).**

Working in fisheries and aquatic science can be both rewarding and challenging. 300 words  
**Describe a situation where you were challenged and how your unique perspective helped you overcome that challenge and/or describe the lessons that you learned regardless of the outcome.**

Be as specific as possible by including explanations and examples in your responses. Each response should be between 200 - 300 words in length with a minimum of 100 words.

Please submit a 1-2 minute video addressing the following question.

**What are your personal, academic, or career goals, and how do you hope an internship in fisheries and aquatic science will help you achieve them? Please describe your goals and explain how participating in the Hutton Program will help you reach them.**

Video responses should focus on answering the specific question without repeating information shared elsewhere in the application. Preference will be given to responses delivered naturally rather than read from a prepared script.



You will need to upload a video file for this question. Video responses longer than 2 minutes will not be scored.

### School Transcripts



All Hutton applicants are required to provide a high school transcript (official or unofficial). Students may upload transcripts themselves in the box to the left or ask that one be submitted by a school administrator/advisor. Please refer to the fields below if a school official will be providing your transcript. If your transcript will be sent via email, please upload a Word Document stating the name and email of who will be uploading your transcript.
